## Meet Jessica Podhorcer

Our Library is a veritable treasure trove of community and library history. Ensuring that the material is well documented and usable by the public can be a challenge given the physical relocations of the Library over the last hundred years. This is where Library Assistant Jessica Podhorcer comes in. It is her responsibility to enhance the organization of and public access to this invaluable collection.



Hired in May, 2015, the majority of Jessica's duties are archival in nature. She can be found combing through tens of thousands of photos, clippings, maps, documents, scrapbooks, manuscripts, and the like in the basement of the Library and in the stacks in the Local History Room.

While these materials are certainly vital to a researcher or historian, they are equally fascinating to any resident who has an interest in a particular aspect of Livingston community/library history or local history in general. For instance, Jessica explained that in 1981 the Board of Education gave the Library its original records of school registration dating back to the 1880s—this is the earliest known such documentation. Another intriguing find was an 1819 math work book of Andrew Littell. The archival collection also includes early circulation and registration records of the Library. For Jessica one of the most surprising finds was seeing the extraordinary development of the Township in the post-WW II era; before then, Livingston was much more rural.

Critical to the use of these materials is surveying, documenting, and organizing what is available. Jessica's background and education make her the perfect candidate to perform this work. As an undergraduate at Brandeis University where she majored in history and minored in Jewish studies, she acquired phenomenal experience in archiving through a series of internships which included assignments with the Joint Distribution Committee in NYC and the Central Archives for the History of the Jewish People in Jerusalem. She also continues part-time archival work with the YIVO Institute for Jewish Research.

When not working on the archives, Jessica can be found at the Circulation Desk. She loves having conversations with patrons about the books she sees them checking out. "It is very exciting when you see someone else reading a favorite book of yours." She explains that it can be very rewarding and fun assisting a patron with a targeted search. As someone who enjoys fantasy literature, she observes that our Library's YA Fantasy collection is off the charts.

Jessica is optimistic that the word will get out to the community about how incredible our Library collection is and that she'll be inundated with requests. Indeed, in July when Friends hosts its first-ever Members-only Social, the program of Library/Livingston Artifacts and History will rely heavily on Jessica's work. We hope many of you can attend that program. In the meantime, if you have questions about our history, we invite you to get in touch with the Library. As Jessica says, "The Library is an incredible place and there is much more to it than many people realize."

# Programming

## Senior Happening:

The series continued to delight seniors and non-seniors alike. The February 19 program featured The Florian Schantz Jazz Combo. Attendees were delighted as the quartet performed an array of favorites including “Aint’ Misbehavin’,” “Roll Out the Barrel,” and “Hold That Tiger” (“Tiger Rag”). During the rendition of “When the Saints Go Marching In”, members of the audience snaked around the room as others clapped in time to the great music. The young Mr. Schantz and his father who plays in the combo also educated the audience, giving history about the development of instruments including the evolution of the trumpet and the coronet. In addition, Florian demonstrated the role of various accessories used to change the sound of the horn such as a plunger! The response of one attendee was typical, “Such a wonderful program! Thea [White] has done it again, finding a great group.” One couple said that they traveled down from Fairfield, NJ when they heard his group would be playing in Livingston. During the social hour, the audience with accompaniment from the Combo, sang happy birthday wishes to Teresa Allard, Friends Treasurer.

The Senior Happening series at the Livingston Library celebrated St. Patrick’s Day with a program of Celtic music performed by the musical duo, Cracked Walnuts. The husband and wife team of Jeff and Jan Ausfahl entertained and informed an audience of nearly 100 attendees on March 18 with their repertoire of Irish and Scottish songs. It began with the very popular and well-known song, “Wild Rover”. The spirit of the music also encouraged Friends Treasurer Teresa Allard and Friends volunteer Jill Alpert to perform an impromptu Irish jig. In keeping with Senior Happening aims of both entertaining and educating, the Ausfahls included background on songs and instruments. An Irish proverb informed their rendition of the Wolf Tones ballad, “Some Say the Devil is Dead”. The team used a variety of instruments including guitar, banjo, and washboard and spoons.

Upcoming programs include the *Fred Miller Lectures-in-Song: Songwriter Harry Warren* in April, and the Livingston High School Jazz Band in May. The spring season will conclude with Joe Gilligan performing *Sinatra and His Friends of the 50's*.

### Centennial Concerts

Audiences have flocked to the Library's Centennial Sunday Afternoon Concert series, proudly sponsored by Friends. The Stirling Duo with the very accomplished Joseph Gluck & Friends performed in February. Annamaria Stefanelli and Rory Angelicola (pictured right with Thea White) returned to the Library in March. The elegantly-arrayed duo performed highlights from, among other operas, *La Traviata*, *The Marriage of Figaro*, and *Turndot*. During the second half of the program, the audience was treated to works from Broadway (*West Side Story*, *Showboat*, *Carousel*, and *Kismet*) and traditional favorites such as "Shenandoah".

On April 10, the Masterwork Camerata Choral Chamber Ensemble will entertain. *Izzy Who? A Tribute to Irving Berlin* is slated for May 15. The always popular Naomi Miller will perform with Annette Sanders, accompanied by jazz pianist Joel Zelnick. The spring concerts will conclude on June 26 with Barnya, the premier folk ensemble performing traditional Russian, Cossack, Ukrainian, Jewish and Roma dancing, music, and songs. Barynya has performed at some of the most prestigious cultural venues in the United States, including Carnegie Hall, the Smithsonian Institute, and the UN. All concerts are on Sundays at 3PM so save the dates. The Centennial Concerts will resume in the fall after a summer hiatus.
